

Student Teaching: August 2019 to December 2019

Placed at Rocky Mountain High School in Fort Collins, CO, for the first eight weeks and then at Olander School for Project Based Learning for the second eight weeks. While at RMHS, I developed a curriculum and taught a two-dimensional design class, and then co-taught a videography class with my mentor teacher. During my time at Olander School for Project Based Learning, I helped manage the classroom and developed several lessons about perspective, radial pattern, pattern, and form for grades K-5.

High School Practicum: January 2019 to May 2019

Placed at Rocky Mountain High School in Fort Collins, CO, for the duration of the semester in a short-film class. During this time, I was able to observe the second class in the line of the videography program where the students were primarily focused on the development of film projects around certain themes where some had required cinematographic elements. While there, I taught two lessons pertaining to the style of stop-motion animation with movies and the basics of lighting when it comes to setting up a film set.
